## **DISCIPLESHIP THOUGHT FROM WORDS**

**FOR WORSHIP.** What does it mean to work for the good of all? In the middle of this admonishment from Paul about reaping what we sow, he includes this encouragement not to become weary and to continue working hard for the good of all. We consistently face challenges in life. Some challenges appear within our own individual life circumstances in our work, in our households, and in our relationships. Some appear in our communities where friendships can be strained, resources stretched, and patience is tested. Some challenges are happening on the world stage, where we have very little influence or control over what happens next. While Paul was not facing the same challenges that we are, he was no stranger to life's difficulties. So, we can hear the words from Galatians, not as condemnation but as encouragement to keep going, knowing that God sees and appreciates our efforts. Also, we are encouraged to remember that the peace of God passes all human understanding and has never been dependent on the judgement of other people.

Jo conducted many wonderful sewing classes with each of the three organisations we continue to support, and there is much excitement from homeless young mums who have gone beyond their basic training to expand their knowledge and skills and are now making items to earn income - a huge change to ensure they can help support and feed their families - Helping to give them dignity and pride. Kalipay children have made many pillowcases to ensure they each have one, and have made other items to wear. Lots of fun had helping them just be children - playing games, spending valuable time teaching them they are important, etc. The evacuated community were able to receive extra tents for shelter and connect with a valuable food supply to ensure they could eat - all this because we were in the right place at the time - able to help make a difference. We met with many young people who are now leading happy successful lives due to the love and care they received at Kalipay as children. Two young abused children were able to be rescued.
